History and background of NSPS Advocacy

How did we get here?

- NSPS Proposal in 2014: HPBA submitted extensive comments
 - Urged EPA to provide sell-through past May 15
- May 2015: HPBA challenged EPA's 2015 Final Rule
- **December 2018**: Extension legislation passed U.S. House of Representatives, failed in Senate at end of 2018 with government shutdown
- 2017 to 2018: Negotiated with EPA on sell-through proposal
- November 2018: EPA proposed sell-through package; HPBA and members submitted comments
- March/April 2020: EPA finalized sell-through proposal and did not provide sell-through





Our Work Since Mid-March

 Relief needed due to coronavirus mitigation efforts forcing store closures and customers not shopping

 Collected stories from 180 retailers and sent a letter to Congressional leaders and to EPA

 For several weeks, we thought there was a possibility of a "Direct Final Rule" which might have provided sell-through until July 15. NO LONGER HAPPENING

Notice of Proposed Rulemaking proposing sell-through to be published



Options for Remaining Step 1 Heaters



What are your options for remaining Step 1 stoves?

- Stoves to Homes Initiative
 - Donate Step 1 freestanding stoves to participating non-profit organizations for changeout programs
 - http://www.hpba.org/stovestohomesinitiative
- Donation form and acknowledgment/acceptance of donation by the receiving non-profit (identifying the donated product by serial number) MUST be done BEFORE May 15



NOTE: Stoves do NOT have to be shipped by Friday.
 Donation acknowledgement must be done before then.

Local Options

What if I want to donate non-freestanding woodstoves or can't afford to ship products?

- Find a non-profit closer to you by looking online for "weatherization programs" near you
 - Might need to help with installation and consumer education
- MUST find a local non-profit and they acknowledge in writing that they can accept the donation, BEFORE May 15
- There is plenty of time to find a household for the heater, they just need to acknowledge the donation







New emissions limits

Operation manual must be "readily accessible" to unit in store


Efficiency and CO values on products (no efficiency or CO minimum)



Step 2 Label and Burn Wise Hangtag

Permanent Label for Step 2 **Back of Woodstove** U.S. ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION AGENCY Certified to comply with May 2020 particulate emission standards using crib wood. MANUFACTURE DATE 2453 2464 2457 Jan Feb Mar Apr May Jun Jul Aug Sep Oct Nov Dec Made in U.S. A DO NOT REMOVE THIS LABEL

Burn Wise voluntary hangtag only for Step 2 products that met requirements before the deadline.





Step 2 Products Only

- Any unit that isn't certified for 2020 cannot be manufactured, sold, or transferred after May 15, 2020
- All newly-tested stoves have their efficiency revealed
 - Need to be able to explain efficiency to consumers
 - Need to be able to also explain carbon monoxide (CO) numbers to consumers
 - Be prepared to explain why efficiency number doesn't necessarily correlate with emission number





EPA Wood Heater and Central Heater Databases

- Get familiar with these databases
 - Wood Heater
 - Central Heater (if you sell these products)
- Be aware that not all information is up to date
- Check with your manufacturers if you aren't sure about a product

Frequently Asked Questions



If I sell a Step 1 product before May 15, 2020 but can't install it until after the effective date, is that ok?

YES

• The rule defines "sale" as "the transfer of ownership or control"

- Not "transfer of ownership and control"
- Must be a transfer of ownership or control to the end-user/consumer, not to a middleman like a contractor or distributor







If I burn a stove in my store to provide heat, or as a display, does that count as used?

NO

- (But you can still use it to heat your store. You just never will be able to sell it or give it away. Put a sign next to store heater that reads, "Store heater. Not for sale.")
- You are a commercial owner. Only noncommercial owners' used stoves count as truly used

 "Commercial Owner" - "any person who owns or controls a wood heater in the course of the business of the manufacture, importation, distribution (including shipping and storage) or sale of the wood heater."







Can I take the Step 1 products from my store to my home and sell them out of my garage as a private owner?

NO

 As a hearth product retailer, you are part of the regulated industry and still considered a "commercial owner," regardless of where you physically sell the products

 "Commercial Owner" - "any person who owns or controls a wood heater in the course of the business of the manufacture, importation, distribution (including shipping and storage) or sale of the wood heater."
